Keynote Speakers

- Tracey George, Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs
 - Vice Provost George oversees faculty affairs at Vanderbilt and is the Charles B.
 Cox III and Lucy D. Cox Family Chair in Law and Liberty and retains her faculty appointment in political science.
 - She manages faculty hiring and retention authorizations, faculty appointments and promotions, faculty awards and honors, and endowed chair appointments and works with academic leaders across campus to enhance Vanderbilt's efforts to support faculty.
- Danielle Certa, Assistant Director of Faculty Appointments
 - Came to Vanderbilt in 2009 after 10 years in the advertising and entertainment industries, relocating to Nashville from Los Angeles.
 - Worked for former Interim Chancellor and Provost Susan Wente and with Vice Provost for Academic and Strategic Initiatives John Geer (now Dean of the College of Arts and Science).
 - In her role as Assistant Director, Danielle provides expert analysis and guidance regarding faculty appointments, reappointments, and promotions; search processes; review processes; faculty data collection as it pertains to federal compliance requirements; as well as ensures compliance with university policies and procedures.
- The Mission of the Office of Faculty Affairs and Professional Education exits to support and champion Vanderbilt faculty at every stage of their career and to promote and advise professional academic programs.
 - Team includes:
 - Associate Provost for Faculty Affairs,
 - Associate Provost for Faculty Development,
 - Center for Teaching, Office of Digital Education,
 - Office of Faculty Development,
 - Office of Academic Program Review, Assessment and Accreditation,
 - Office of Faculty Appointments,
 - Office of Strategy and Communication
 - Dynamic Collaboration six offices working in tandem to optimize faculty experience and enhance academic excellence.
 - Dean's Search Process:

- Deans have 5-year terms.
- Search Process is very time consuming about 9 months.
- Provost triggers decanal review.
- OAPRAA oversees internal and external review.
- VPFAPSE forms; OFD and OSC guide search committee
- OFD coordinates candidate visits.
- OFA handles hiring logistics and appointments.
- OSC announces and stewards faculty-forward narrative
- OFD facilitates on boarding and training.
- VPFAPE provides ongoing leadership and guidance.
- ODE serves as business dev.
- CFT designs best practices around teaching priorities.
- A&S Dean's Search will include a full-time staff member on the Search Committee – will be announced soon – 1st time.
- Faculty Hiring Process:
 - OFA oversees hiring.
 - OFD conducts new faculty orientation.
 - CFT trains incoming faculty
 - ODE provides course development/platform support.
 - CFT provides ongoing development or remediation.
 - OFA handles milestones, tenure, appointments, and emeriti.
 - OFD trains for leadership/culture/faculty experience
 - OAPRAA assesses, opens and closes programs, document qualifications for accreditation requirements.
 - OSC communicates achievements, opportunities, coordinates committees and initiatives.
 - VPFAPE oversees committees, initiatives, discipline, etc.
- o Interested in partnering with USAC in developing opportunities to train up.

EDI Training

- Christopher Donald, University Chaplain, and Director of Religious Life
- Gretchen Person, Associate University Chaplain, and Associate Director of Religious Life
 - How to engage in a dialogue about religious diversity in the workplace to help foster understanding of religious minorities in the Vanderbilt community.
 - To better understand religions on campus must first collect information. Staff Survey asked specific questions about religions.
 - Etiquette prevents us from talking about religion.
 - When asking questions about religion remember to do it from a place of curiosity and for learning purposes. Do not be intrusive. Do not proselytize.
 - Specifics to consider in the workplace:
 - Dress
 - VU has a free dress code; VUPS might be an exception.
 - Dietary Restrictions
 - Be proactive and ask new staff when onboarding.
 - Consider catering staff events from using Grins Vegetarian Café or from Holy Smokes

- Grins Vegetarian Cafe in the Schulman Center for Jewish Life offers vegetarian wraps, salads, paninis, and baked goods with a Koshercertified kitchen.
- Holy Smokes (formerly Aryeh's Kitchen) opened in May 2016 and is located in the heart of Vanderbilt University's campus. Since then, the iconic mobile food Airstream trailer has been serving up the finest kosher dining options with a southern twist. Holy Smokes is also available for pre-order on the GET app.
