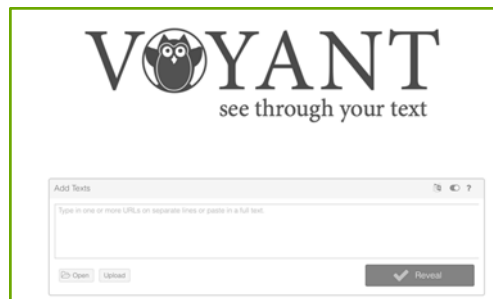

You will also need to provide an image that the site will put with your project. This might be a screenshot of your project or the application you are using. For example:



Optional: You may make a screen recording to accompany your project so that others understand how to use the website or application.

Uploading your project

Once you have developed your project, go to languagepanda.org and click on “submit” at the top of the screen.

Basic information

- Project name
- Language
- Language Level (all, novice, intermediate, advanced)
- Length of the project (one class, entire semester, etc.)
- Tags/keywords associated with your project
- Type of digital tool (website, application, social media, etc.)
- Any costs or links related to the project
