MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is time to celebrate and be proud. The Vanderbilt Woman's Club Stapleton/Weaver Scholarship has hit a major philanthropy milestone this fall - our fourth scholarship recipient.

Some background. Early in the scholarship's history, going back to 1970, financial awards to students were made from funds raised by the club, initially to only one student. The Vanderbilt Woman's Club Stapleton/ Weaver Scholarship was established in 2007 to provide financial support to a deserving undergraduate student based on academics, citizenship and financial need. A few years later it was decided by the club to create and fund an endowment that would perpetually grow and produce the revenue to pay for the scholarship. Starting with just one \$5,000 annual scholarship for one student, the goal was to have one scholar in each class at Vanderbilt receiving a \$5,000 award each year.

And now we have achieved this goal. This is our chance to celebrate our past, present, and future and recognize the efforts of hundreds of VWC women over the years. We can say thank you to every member or friend of VWC who donated money, time, and/or effort to the scholarship fund and endowment. This includes: the ScholarSips parties, "Bridge Extravaganzas," cookie exchanges, craft and bake sales, flower sales, "Phantom Ball," silent auctions, fashion shows, and of course donations to our Capital Campaigns. We also can be part of the future as our fundraising efforts continue and evolve to add to the endowment and increase the amount of the scholarships

because as we know, college costs are not going down.

As a member of VWC I am honored to be part of continuing the legacy of the visionaries who started this club 130 years ago and those who aspired to making a real difference in the education of deserving young people at Vanderbilt University through a scholarship fund -- and you should be too. Kudos!

Vanderbilt Women's Basketball: Back to Prominence

Shea Ralph was named the sixth head coach in Vanderbilt women's basketball history on April 13, 2021. The 2023-24 season marks her third leading the Commodores.

A seven-time national champion as a student-athlete or coach, Ralph arrived at Vanderbilt after spending the previous 13 seasons as an assistant coach alongside Geno Auriemma at the University of Connecticut. While serving as a coach at her alma mater, Ralph helped guide the Huskies to 12 Final Four appearances and six national championships, including a record four consecutive titles from 2013-16.

Ralph orchestrated one of the biggest turnarounds in program history during the 2023-24 season, as the Commodores went from being projected last in the SEC preseason polls to earning the program's first bid into the NCAA Tournament in 10 seasons.

Vanderbilt went 22-9 in Year 3 under Ralph's direction, as the Commodores made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since the 2013-14 campaign. The 22 wins marked a 10-win improvement from a season ago, which is the second-largest win improvement from one season to the next in program history.

As one of the most celebrated student-athletes in women's basketball history, Ralph ranks eighth in UConn's storied record book with 1,678 points. She also ranks among the program's all-time top 10 in career assists (456), steals (252) and field goal percentage (57.9). Ralph graduated from Connecticut in 2001 with a degree in exercise physiology.

In leading UConn to a national championship in 2000, Ralph was named an All-American and Big East Player of the Year. She was selected as the most valuable player in the 2000 NCAA Women's Final Four. She also won the Honda Award, presented to the premier female student-athlete in 12 collegiate sports, and the "Sports Illustrated for Women" Player of the Year.

Ralph was selected by the Utah Starzz in the 2001 WNBA Draft, but was unable to pursue a professional career due to a knee injury.

Ralph and her husband, Tom Garrick, have one daughter, Maysen. Currently a member of the Vanderbilt coaching staff, Garrick served as head coach of the UMass-Lowell women's basketball program from 2018-21 and previously served as a Vanderbilt assistant from 2009-15


